New Business:

1. Jessica Wilcox NHDES Coordinator and Transportation Specialist
 - The benefits of Electric Cars
 - 4800 current registered Electric Cars
 - There are currently 3 types of charging available: Level 1 (Standard Wall Outlet), Level 2 (220 Outlet), Direct Current Fast Charging (requires Three Phase Power)
 - Direct Current Fast Charging has 3 methods: SAE, CHAdeMO and Tesla.
 - Currently have 15 Direct Current Fast Charging Stations
 - The Clean School Bus program and grants associated with the program.
 - The permitting process for charging stations needs to be standardized.
 - Options on how the Town can proceed, Towns that are currently doing this, Battery storage.

- Gas tax vs no tax on EV

2. Dave Wholley Director of Public Works and Municipal Facilities

- Dave was welcomed to the meeting and is going to be a valuable resource.
- Concerned about EV charging stations, tripping hazards, plows hitting them, who repairs damage
- Believes Auburn Rd would be the most viable location for solar panels.
- Energy audit was done on LED lighting
- We should be looking at HVAC efficiency options and software and working toward a central HUB, building management system.
