Acceptance of Minutes:

Housekeeping & Main Topics

- Peter Richard and his son, Sebastian, were at the meeting to find out more about the committee and what we do and what the Town does for waste disposal and recycling. They are from Cub Scout Pack 501 and they would like the Pack to be more involved with the Town's solid waste process. They were also looking on how they might be able to arrange a trip to Waste Management's single stream recycling facility in Billerica. Bob discussed the Town's program and how the Town handles the solid waste that we produce.
- The committee discussed the composting initiative and Lynn gave a rundown of the program status. The SWEC has received 55 positive responses from residents who would like to order a composting bin/pail. The committee decided that the sign up for the bins/pails should end on Thursday April 18, 2019.
- The committee discussed some NRRA training sessions being offered in Plymouth, NH on May 2, 2019, with topics regarding composting and batteries. There was some discussion among the committee on the possibility of the Town picking up some of the costs should someone wish to go. Bob said he would check into Town involvement to help pay for the costs. The committee felt that the individuals who might like to attend would need to show some positive advantage for the Town to be considered for reimbursement.
- We published a compost bin offer for the March column (Rick/Paul). The
 Conservation Commission will do the April column, which will focus on lawn care
 and the Committee will provide the May column (Joy), which will be about the
 state of recycling today.
- There was a roundtable discussion on trying to ban plastic straws in Londonderry. The committee felt it would be a good idea since several municipalities in the USA are doing this, however most thought that it would be a hard sell in Londonderry and New Hampshire. We also began a discussion on making the committee more proactive on certain issues. This conversation will continue in future meetings.

There were no other roundhouse discussions at the end of the meeting.
