How to Register a Newly Purchased Vehicle

Here is important information about what you will need to register your newly purchased vehicle.

PLATES

<u>New Plates</u> – If you are planning to get new plates, you have choices. Please visit <u>NH Plate Types</u> to decide on the plates you want. If you are getting a vanity plate, please use the state plate lookup to determine if your choice is currently available by visiting <u>NH Plate Lookup</u>. You can save time by filling out the <u>DMV Application for Initial Plates</u> prior to your visit.

<u>Transferring Plates</u> – You can transfer plates from another vehicle if the primary owner of the old and the new vehicle is **the same**. You must surrender the <u>original current</u> registration for the old vehicle. A copy is not acceptable. Should you need to get a duplicate of the old vehicle's registration, we can provide that to you at the time of transfer for a fee of \$18.

TYPE OF PURCHASE

Unless you are presenting a dealer or lender-prepared NH Certificate of Title Application to the clerk, ALL owners listed on the vehicle must be present at the time of registration.

From a New Hampshire dealer?

- 1. The Town Clerk copy of the dealer-prepared NH Certificate of Title application
- 2. Your Driver's License

From an Out-Of-State dealer?

- 1. The Town Clerk copy of the dealer or lender-prepared NH Certificate of Title application **if** one was prepared (<u>not common</u>) OR
- 2. The title to the vehicle If you have financed your purchase, the lienholder can mail the title to our office for processing
- 3. Your signed bill of sale showing the name and address of your lienholder (if financed)
- 4. Your Driver's License

<u>From a Private Sale?</u>

- 1. For vehicles year 2000 or newer, bring the title to the vehicle properly executed on the back with Seller(s) and Buyer(s) signatures and the odometer reading AND a copy of your bill of sale **if** you have one. All buyers listed on the title must be present.
- 2. If you financed the vehicle, the Town Clerk copy of the lender-prepared NH Certificate of Title application. We will need your lienholder information including their address. If you don't have a Title Application, the lender will need to mail the title to our office for processing.
- 3. For vehicles 1999 or older, a proper bill of sale AND a copy of the title, or an original registration from the last owner, or a VIN Verification from the local Police Department or Inspection Station.
- 4. Your Driver's License

Leased Vehicle?

- 1. The Town Clerk copy of the dealer-prepared NH Certificate of Title application OR the original title
- 2. Your signed lease agreement
- 3. A copy of your Driver's License

TEMPORARY PLATES

Temporary (or 20-day) plates are <u>not available</u> at the Town Clerk's office. These must be obtain through the NH DMV.
